Research Director – North Central Region IR-4 Pesticide Analytical Laboratory

The North Central Region IR-4 program located in the Department of Entomology at Michigan State University is seeking a fixed term Assistant Professor to act as the Director for its analytical laboratory. The successful applicant will have a Ph.D. in analytical chemistry or a related subject and will be responsible for the operations of the laboratory which conducts pesticide residue analysis in support of EPA registration petitions. The laboratory currently has six analysts and a comprehensive collection of modern analytical equipment. Essential characteristics are a strong capability in residue analysis, and superior administrative and communication skills, along with essential computer skills and the ability to work in a multicultural environment. Knowledge of and the demonstrated ability to operate under EPA's Good Laboratory Practice requirements and three years experience in analytical laboratory management are strongly preferred. This is a non-tenure track annual (12 month basis) appointment. Salary is commensurate with experience and qualifications.
